# Winter Fuel Grant 2018

Applications for grants towards the costs of winter fuel bills are invited from residents of the Ancient Parish of Burham.

To qualify for assistance applicants should be aged 65 years or over and have lived within the boundaries of the Ancient Parish for the past 10 years.

The weekly HOUSEHOLD income of applicants, i.e. the total income from all occupants, must not exceed £265 for single occupancy or £335 for multiple occupancy. For this purpose, income is determined after deducting half of rent payable (rent after deducting any housing benefit received) and ignoring attendance allowance and similar state benefits and credits. Only one application per household will be considered. The Trustees reserve the right to make such enquiries as they believe necessary to confirm entitlement to the grant.

# BURHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

As you have hopefully seen the surface to the Village Hall overflow car park is in the process of being addressed. Work commenced on 12 November and it is anticipated the work could take up to 6 weeks. It was necessary to close the car park and the recycling area for a few weeks whilst the top area was being attended to. Hopefully by the time this hits the mats, the recycling area should be open to pedestrians. The plastic bank was re-sited to the grassed area between the main and the overflow car park so that it could be accessed by the public and the service vehicle for emptying. One each of the glass banks were moved on a temporary basis to Wouldham Recycling site to help with possible overflow. The steps and the gate accessing the dog walking field behind the village hall, together with access to the parish office remains open to pedestrians for the duration of the works. It was not practicable to keep the area completely open whilst the works was carried out.

Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme: This is a wonderful scheme for young people and two participants doing to bronze level in our village are litter picking for their volunteering section of the award. Another is working towards the Silver Award. Please talk to them and encourage them if you see them when you are out and about.

KCC now have funding to sort out the junction of New Court Rd and Burham Court Rd so that Lorries and other vehicles can readily turn left. MR10 will also be repaired and concrete blocks put across the PROW to restrict vehicle traffic whilst keeping it open for all legitimate PROW users. KCC will plan this over the winter with a view of taking action in the mid to late spring 2019.

The Parish Council has some allotment plots available. Please contact David Young on 01634 867669 for more information.

Don't forget to contact me if you are experiencing difficulties with the 155 day time bus service, whether it be lateness, no show or driver problems, as I am still logging the incidents.

Pete Bench: This is going forward and will be positioned in the recreation ground near to or under the Millennium Oak. A remembrance plaque will be installed on the bench. Our thanks to the Thursday Coffee Club and Mr. Jim Dowle who donated towards the cost of the bench/plaque and groundworks.

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We reported last month the changes to kerbside recycling to come into effect from March 2019. It is hoped that representation from TMBC will be available to answer any questions from members of the public at our monthly meeting on 25th March 2019. (This is subject to confirmation). The main recycling site at the Village Hall overflow car park will remain in situ subject to monitoring after March 2019, although other recycling sites within the borough will be closing. Alex Hill/Rochester Rd roadworks: This commenced early November for up to 6 weeks and relates to replacement of the cast iron gas main for a more durable plastic pipe. Three way traffic lights were installed.

Once again we need to remind dog owners to be a responsible dog owner and pick up any mess that is made by your dog. The recreation ground is an area for all to enjoy and not the place for dog poo. When out walking your dog, please ensure that you have sufficient dog poo bags in order to bag it up and dispose of it appropriately. The Parish Council may have to consider installing cameras to catch offenders if this continues.

With the darker evenings and the winter months upon us, if you see any street lights out or pot holes that needs addressing, please let me know so that I can contact the authorities.

Finally, we would like to wish all our residents a very merry Christmas and a peaceful and happy New Year.

# COACH LINK TO LONDON BOOSTS THE COMMUTER APPEAL OF PETERS VILLAGE

Peters Village has a new commuter link into London, following the launch of coach services by Clarkes of London.

The 764a and 764b service picks up from the bus stops at Keepers Cottage Lane (05:55 and 06:32) and Village Road (05:57 and 06:34).

The long-distance link comes hard on the heels of the new community's connection to the local bus network, through Arriva's 155 service between the Medway Towns and Maidstone, which already stops at neighbouring Wouldham, Burham and Eccles.

With the new connection to London now also operational, Clarkes said commuters can benefit from several offers to switch their current journey by rail or car, including 'try before you buy', 10% off a first ticket purchase, and a trade-in deal against an existing rail season ticket.

The company also claims that rail commuters can save more than £1,000 a year by changing, while also benefitting from free on-board wi-fi and entertainment, a guaranteed (and reclining) seat, and a mobile phone tracker for coaches operating the service.

Founded in 1958, Clarkes operates more than 50 coaches on commuter routes, plus private and VIP hire, and is part of The Kings Ferry group within National Express.

Clarkes of London Commuter Manager Sarah Hackett said: "We are excited to be introducing our commuter service to Peters Village and welcoming some new commuters on-board.

"We offer a cost-effective alternative to rail and, with two pick-up points within the village and key drop offs in Canary Wharf, the City and Westminster, we are also a more convenient service."

The move was welcomed in turn by Peters Village developer, Trenport. Director Chris Hall said: "This is an excellent addition to the appealing package being offered to people re-locating to Peters Village. Clarkes of London is a high-quality operator and now offers a third commuting option to the city, and enhances the community's enviable transport links for jobs, education, leisure and socialising."

# FINAL CONSULTATION ON BORROWING TO TARMAC THE CAR PARK ON KNOWLE ROAD

Wouldham Parish Council (WPC) would like to apply to the Secretary of State for borrowing approval to take out an exclusive-fixed low rate loan with the Public Works Loan Board (PWLB) for £50,000, repayable over a 5 year term, to tarmac the car park at Knowle Road, Wouldham. WPC take their duty of care to the residents of Wouldham very seriously. We are concerned that the car park is now becoming unsafe, and the craters can no longer be refilled successfully due to heavy usage as parking becomes more difficult in the village. By resurfacing the car park and adding properly laid out white lined parking bays, we can double the

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The car park is a very important asset of the village:

It is used by residents.

The hirers of the village hall.

For Fun Days.

For customers of the Medway Inn (an important business in the village).

Rural Kent for their coffee mornings.

By parents dropping children off to school.

Dropping/collecting young children from Jellybeans

Anyone using the village hall, a community facility for the whole village.

Help in keeping our two pubs & shop busy and key to any vibrant community.

Anyone bringing their younger children to the play area.

Parking whilst using the rec for football etc. or during our very successful family Fun Days.

WPC have already purchased and installed CCTV for the car park which has proved very useful in reporting incidents and deterring crime in the car park.

The new pathway across the Rec is part of a wider village plan by WPC to enable pedestrians, especially children to easily get from one side of the village to another without having to walk along the busy, narrow High St. We are in consultation with KCC to put in appropriate traffic calming measures throughout the village and an improved and safe car park for residents is an important part of this plan.

WPC are also working to get extra parking in the centre of the village near the Tramway, which WPC see as an integrated part of their plan for the village.

The PC have worked hard on figures for the borrowing to ensure that we get the best possible interest rate and the best possible quote for the work. The business plan is on our website, but here is our recommended repayment schedules for the duration of the loan:

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### December & January in your Garden

'Anyone who thinks gardening begins in Spring & ends in the Autumn is missing the best part of the year, for gardening begins in January with the dream.'

As one gardening year draws to a close then another one begins just as quickly. As the seasons now are less defined it does allow the seasons to extend and enable us to enjoy our gardens for longer. By including winter interest plants such as Cyclamen and evergreen Sarcococa, or Cornus for their stem colour its possible to create winter scenes in your Garden that are still delightful to look at. Now the trees have lost their leaves you can see the structure and shape of them & as long as the weather is mild then you can prune any stems or branches that are in the wrong place. To create a festive feel out in the garden over the festivities you can tie fairy lights around the trunk & branches, & hang a few baubles too. For indoor festive colour there's always Poinsettias for Christmas, that should last well into the New Year, & for scent Hyacinth are perfect. Decorating mantlepieces and picture frames with winter foliage such as vew, ivv and holly also brings the outdoors in for the duration, and berried stems mixed with winter stems and foliage can look wonderful in a vase too. The new year signals the start of the next season for the garden, with hellebores and snowdrops making early appearances in the garden. It's also the ideal time to plan for the coming year – once the days start to lengthen & the ground starts to warm up it's possible to lightly dig over the soil and prepare any beds for the new season. December & January are the perfect time to prune fruit trees, to maintain an open goblet shape remove stems and branches heading towards the centre of the tree, and remove any dead, diseased or damaged branches too. However, do not prune stone fruit trees, such as cherries and plums, until summer as they are susceptible to diseases in the winter.

Also prune climbing roses now, remove older stems and prune new growth back to two buds, and gather up and leaves that have been shed over winter and dispose to discourage any spread of black spot next season. Acers, vines and Wisteria can also be pruned now.

In the vegetable garden, lift any remaining veg left in the soil such as carrots, parsnips and leeks, before the soil becomes too frozen. Also continue to clear any remaining debris from summer crops to the compost heap, & spread any compost that is ready to be used across beds to allow it to be worked in by the worms over the next few months.

By December garlic sets should be planted out, & January is the ideal time to plant onion sets.

It's also good to get chilli and tomato seeds sown as they need a long germination period. It's an ideal time to get started with an allotment too – the digging & prep work can all be starred prior to the growing season. Other things to do now:

Take hardwood cuttings of shrubs.

Plant raspberry canes, and strawberry crowns ready for new harvests Keep bird feeders topped up, and bird baths defrosted for the birds Float a tennis ball on your pond to ensure the top has an air gap for any plants or insects that are in your pond.

Wash tools and pots ready for the new season.

They will require the date and time of the incident, the direction of the bus and brief details of the problem. This should be done as soon as possible after the incident and the details will then be passed to Kent County Council for follow up action.

Any poor service we suffer from now will take time to sort out and it is dependent on timely reporting of the problems as they occur.
