This month the Methodist Church in Burham is supporting the charity CALM (Campaign Against Living Miserably), which is dedicated to preventing male suicide. Death's from suicide is the single biggest killer of men under 45 in the UK, and 75% of all suicides in 2015 were male. CALM offers support to men in the UK of any age via their Helpline, Website and Webchat. They challenge a culture that prevents men from seeking emotional help when they most need it. Men are expected to be in control at all times and failure to be seen as such equates to weakness and loss of masculinity. 

Traffic

We have heard from KCC that they have commissioned an independent strategic transport review to cover Wouldham, Burham and Eccles. They will be putting in a barrier and dropped kerb at Knowle Road at the end of the pathway and some signs warning about the crossing at the Village Hall. The PC continue to work hard on the problem of traffic in the village and have commissioned yearly traffic surveys. These are on our website. PETERS VILLAGE NEWS

Stella offers hi-vis crossing comfort in the winter gloom

As Wouldham and Peters Village schoolchildren and their families stand by for the worst of winter, they will be cheered to see Stella Wingate running the school crossing patrol.

Stella was appointed at the beginning of the autumn term 2018 after funding provided to Wouldham All Saints Church of England Primary School by Peters Village developer Trenport, and the housebuilders of the site: Bellway, Ashbury and Orbit.

Since then, clad in her hi-visibility uniform, she has helped hundreds of children cross the road at the Medway Inn junction, between Knowle Road, High Street and Hall Road, a role that becomes increasingly important in gloomy wintertime conditions before and after school.

"I love the job, especially as I've lived in Wouldham for 17 years now and feel I'm contributing something to a village I've come to love," said Stella. "The children always say 'thank you' after I've seen them across the road safely and that gives me a warm feeling".

"I've also had fantastic support from the school and the head, Carl Fitter. The hours are handy too, as I can be home when my 16-year-old daughter Jade comes in from her own school day.

"I was surprised to learn that I would need two days' training, but the course was actually very useful and gave me a better insight into all the safety aspects," she added.

The role also adds neatly to what really has been a caring career for Stella, who previously worked as a registered nurse and an occupational health advisor, before 'retiring' last Easter after ten years as a self-employed foot health practitioner.

"I like to be active, so a lot of my spare time is spent outside, gardening and walking the dog and also in the local church choir," added Stella, who has moved around in her career, with locations including the Lake District, Cornwall and nine years in South Africa.

Wouldham school moved from its former site in the centre of village in February last year to an all-new purpose-built complex – the land and funding being provided by Trenport – in order to cater for both the children of Wouldham and those living on Peters Village, which is set to have 1,000 homes within the next few years. continued

The school's head, Carl Fitter, said: "The new school location is ideally placed for Wouldham and the new community at Peters Village, but the safety of children walking to the new school was paramount, so we are absolutely delighted to have Stella as our 'lollipop lady'. Everybody loves her here!"

If you have planted pots of bulbs in Autumn, then these will now be starting to come to life and will soon be flowering their socks off, a light feed especially if they've been in the pot for more than one season will help them to perform at their best.

February is also a good time to get things started on the vegetable garden. Onion sets can be planted out, together with Broad Bean seeds as both are hardy. Sow extra beans in pots on a window sill or in the shed to grow on in case any of the outdoor plants get caught be frost or nibbled by garden pests. Other seeds that can be sown now are brassicas such as broccoli and cabbage, keep these in a cool shed or greenhouse to germinate, and tomatoes & chillies which will benefit from a warm windowsill and the occasional warmth of the heating (just don't let them dry out).

It's also a good time to review what seeds you have – remember to use up left-over seeds if you can as some won't store for more than a few years – and then replenish those that are needed. There is so much choice now amongst the various websites & catalogues that every taste is catered for in vegetables, fruit & flowers, so it's well worth trying something different each year along-side your favourites – who knows you may discover some new favourites !! Seed sowing is also a great activity to get kids involved in – mini varieties work well. Any cuttings taken last year should also be starting to show signs of growth in the next month, so keep a close eye on them, offering them some protection if the weather turns particularly harsh, but also ensuring they have adequate water if the weather is dry to encourage strong, healthy roots.

Other things to be doing in the garden now:

- Vary the feed on your bird tables to encourage a range of birds into your garden this years RSPB Birdwatch is on 26-28th Jan 19 so make a date with your garden & record who visits.
- Prune Wisteria & Fuschia by cutting back summers side shoots to 2-3 buds.
- Prepare veg beds by removing any weeds, lightly forking over, and/or covering with a generous layer of compost.

Welcome back after the Christmas break. We you all had a lovely time. Just to clarify: Changes in recycling from the home (kerbside) will be implemented by TMBC. The new contract starts on 1st March 2019 which will initially remain the same as now while preparation is made to launch the new recycling collection service. The new service is expected to be available to all residents by November 2019. An overview of the new service is a weekly food waste collection, a fortnightly collection of waste which can't be recycled, an alternative fortnightly collection of mixed dry recyclables (plastics, cartons and glass), with a separate container for paper and card. There is also a separate fortnightly collection of garden waste (as an "opt in" charged service). Further full details will be published by TMBC and residents will be informed before any change takes place. At our 25th March monthly meeting, a TMBC representative will be in attendance to answer any queries residents may have.

As you are hopefully aware, the work to the Village Hall overflow car park was completed before Christmas. The contractors (Southeast Groundworks) in fact finished the work within 4 weeks, well ahead of schedule. Many positive comments have been received by residents on the professional finish. Now that the area is neat and tidy, please ensure that parking is also neat and tidy, so that as many vehicles as possible can use the upgraded facilities. Parking in the village is at a premium and by parking "pretty" more spaces becomes available for all to us.

Pete's Bench has been installed in the recreation ground near to the Millennium Oak. A dedication service for Pete's bench has been arranged for Thursday 31st January 2019 at 11am. All residents are welcome to attend.

Arriva bus service. Please continue to advise me of any difficulties that you are experiencing with the service, whether it be lateness, no show or driver problems, as I am still logging the incidents. *continued*

We have been advised that for 6 months from 02.01.2019 - 02.06.2019. Southern gas networks will be carrying out existing pipe replacements along the whole length of Borstal Street up to Priestfield, with multi way temporary traffic lights.

This will bring delays to the 155 service which is beyond their control, also there will bus stop closures put in place during these works.
