



## CHURCH OF ENGLAND WORSHIP





You may well be thinking how come Mike needs an assistant in this small church! Curates often do go to larger churches, but our church leaders take the view that a Curate is still in training, and that our parish will give a good training experience, and in particular in our case a knowledge of working in a semi-rural parish with a new housing development. Chris has already done 3 years of ministry training at St. Augustine's College, the local training scheme for Rochester and Canterbury Diocesan ordinands. He has studied, amongst other things, the Bible and its interpretation, Church History, Ethics, Worship in the Church of England, Philosophy of Religion, World Religions and other things that he will probably be able to remind me about, it being 41 years since I finished at theological college!

I am looking forward to being in a training role, as Chris learns about conducting public worship, (including in schools when it becomes possible for those outside the bubbles to be there again, God willing)) leading nurture groups, conducting Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals, supporting those in need and visiting the sick. We will also be seeking constructive feedback from church members and parishioners about how he is getting on.

One other thing you need to know about Chris. Although eventually he is preparing for full-time ministry, at present he is a self-supporting minister. That means that he has a day job! So he will be with us on Sundays and the equivalent of one day a week at different times of the day and evening. A full-time curacy typically lasts for 3 years, but Chris will have the opportunity to be with us for up to 6 years.

Please join me in prayer for Chris at this time, and may we all be blessed by being able to share in his training. In peace, Mike

#### CHURCH OF ENGLAND SERVICES

Holy Communion at All Saints Wouldham. Every Sunday at 10.30am

These services also take place on zoom for those unable to attend personally, please email Mike for the invitation link.

In church, seating is at 2 metre spacing, though households may sit together, please wait to be seated, and face coverings must be worn except for those who are exempt. All should use sanitiser provided on entering church. Communion is in one kind only and is received standing with arms outstretched and hands open. The priest after using sanitiser will drop the consecrated wafer into the hands without touching them. Congregational singing is not allowed at the present time and the services are shorter (approx. 35 minutes). If you wish to donate, collection is by text giving for those not already doing standing orders.

There are no refreshments after the service at present. But there is peace, joy, hope and a warm welcome.

Additionally, the church is open to visitors every Sunday from after the service until 2pm.







After almost six months where the majority of our pupils have not been at school, we reopened the school doors to all of our pupils on 1<sup>st</sup> September. We were able to open to a limited number of pupils towards the end of Term 6, and this meant that our Year 6 pupils were able to say goodbye to friends and staff before they started at secondary school in September. We would like to wish them all the best of luck at their new schools.

During the lockdown, and for part of the Summer holidays, we were open to the children of key workers, but it has been lovely to once again have all of our pupils at school and we would like to welcome our new Reception class and their families to the school, as well as any other new pupils who are joining us for this academic year.

As you can imagine, life in school at the moment is not quite what we are used to, however parents, pupils and staff have all embraced this new 'normal' and we are pleased with the way it is working. We are operating a staggered start and finish for different year groups as well as utilising the different entry points for the school. All children are in their own Year group 'bubbles' and do not mix with other Year groups within the school. Of course hand hygiene, cleanliness and social distancing are paramount and all children and staff are very aware of their importance. We are using all of the resources we have in school, including our lovely outdoor space, to ensure that our children remain fit and healthy, both physically and mentally, and to ensure that the return to school has been as normal as possible. All of the measures we have taken to enable the school to reopen are there to protect both children and staff as well as the wider community.

Sadly, due to the current situation, we are unable to hold our large fundraising events such as our Annual Firework Display and our Christmas Fair. We hope that these events will be able to return next year and be bigger and better than ever.

#### REWARD OFFERED IN CRACKDOWN ON DAMAGE AT PETERS VILLAGE

Trenport is offering a £200 reward to anyone providing information on an act of criminal damage or illegal trespass at Peters Village, which then leads to successful criminal prosecution.



Recent offences include graffiti, the smashing of paving slabs under Peters Bridge and throwing these into the river (around 1pm on 15 July) and illegal vehicle trespass on to the Riverside Esplanade.

A spokesman for Trenport – the overall developer at Peters Village – said: "Peters Village has a lower than average incidence of criminal damage and vandalism and the community has an excellent Neighbourhood Watch, which aims to nip such anti-social behaviour in the bud.

"However, as the community's developer, we also want to pursue a 'zero tolerance' policy and prosecute or deter the small minority of people who want to ruin this attractive and growing community for the majority."

#### **Phoenix Medical Practice**

I would like to say on behalf of everyone at the Practice, how much we appreciate all the care and support that so many individuals have given to our

patients who have needed help throughout this crisis be they elderly, vulnerable, shielding etc. This has shown that irrespective of which village you may live in, there is a caring community that has embraced and supported the whole area.

As most of you will know, we will be re-locating to a brand new larger purpose built surgery in Peters Village scheduled for late summer 2021 which will ensure the future of our practice and the continued provision of care to all patients within our catchment area. There are going to be additional challenges, some of which were highlighted at the engagement events we held back in November last year a lot of which focussed around our elderly and vulnerable patients.

I did mention to people at the engagement events that we as a practice want to work with the community across all the villages to look at ways we can help those patients that will be in greater need when we relocate. It has been amazing how quickly volunteer networks have been set up which have included things such as collection of patients medications and I would very much like to build on this to explore how we as a practice can help to support services that will benefit as many of our patients as possible. We do have a Patient Participation Group (PPG) but I will admit that the lines of communication have not been as good as I would have hoped for which I apologise. Ideally this PPG needs to be patient driven and have someone with the time and ability to take the lead as representative to those patients that feel they wish to contribute. We can then work together to discuss any key issues raised by patients and have an active forum for the Practice to pass on relevant information.

I'm wondering if we can look at combining re-igniting our PPG as well as exploring how we can help our elderly and vulnerable patients for when we relocate? At this stage I am open to hear ideas that anyone would have, what type of forum to communicate via e.g. Facebook, Zoom etc. and if there is anyone that feels they would be willing to help drive the PPG as its patient lead.

What I would appreciate is any thoughts/suggestions/comments to be put to me via our practice email – **gp.G82234@nhs.net**. Also if anyone feels they would like to help drive this by becoming a lead (or deputy) for your PPG then please let me know.

A virtual meeting with reduced agenda items did take place in August which is very unusual.

Pilgrims Way/Split Road – As I am sure you are aware the rubbish has started to build up again. We have already been in contact with TMBC, who arranges for contractors to litter pick on a rolling road closure basis. TMBC have advised "contractor unable to address at the current time". Hopefully by the time this magazine is circulated, the rubbish would have been cleared, although last time it took several months for the work to happen. I will keep an eye on the situation and will re-contact TMBC in due course, if nothing occurs.

As a reminder, please ensure that when you are parking that you are not parked on double yellow lines, across drive-ways or anywhere else which could cause a problem to other motorists and pedestrians. Spending a few moments just to check will be appreciated by all.

There is still no update on the TMBC Saturday free of charge bulky refuse. Their latest information is "Currently there are no plans to reinstate this service at the moment; any updates will be posted on our website. Apologies for the inconvenience." As soon as we receive an update, it will be posted on our website and Facebook page.

Whilst we do continually receive complaints/comments in relation to anti-social behaviour particularly along New Court Road, the Parish Council does not have any powers to address this type of behaviour. ALL ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR needs to be reported to Kent Police, either on 101 or via the Kent Police website at the time that the incident is happening if possible. The Police are the acting authority and The more calls/logs that they receive, the more likelihood they will attend. Whilst residents may be reluctant to make the call, it is the only way to ensure that the Police are fully aware of the situation and they can see that this is and has been an on-going problem.

As reported last month, there are a good number of dog poo bag holders which have been installed around the village, near to or close to bins. So if you happen to forget your dog poo bag when you are walking the dog, there should be bags available nearby.

If you happen to see a holder which is empty, please let me know as I have a supply at the office awaiting usage. More signs in relation to this have also been installed around the village. Let's try and keep Burham areas free of dog poo and all the nasties that it can carry.

The annual inspection of the "play" equipment which includes the youth shelter, Spectra, MUGA and of course the kiddies play area equipment took place in late August by Wicksteed. No high risk areas were identified, which was great.

#### VILLAGE HALL

Once again we have to report that the sale of the old hall and the purchase of the new hall is still progressing, it has been a long haul but will be worth it to have this new asset for Wouldham. #### RECREATION GROUND

We would like to thank John Head for preparing the ground along the wall on the Recreation Ground for wildflower seed planting, after much discussion the plan is for a couple of pathways through the area but planting of wildflowers and possibly some trees. We would also like to thank Anne and Sue for all their efforts on this area, sadly it was too big an area for 2 volunteers but we hope they will be happy with the result. The Parish Council are happy for residents to put gates through their wall onto the Rec, but we cannot allow permanent pathways. This is private property and has to be maintained for the village.

#### HALL ROAD

The PC are aware that the trees lining Hall Road between the road and the new pathway are dead elms, KCC are looking into removing them as they are unsafe during strong wind. What to do with the hedgerow after that is under discussion but will cost quite a bit of money to replant.

You can only use these sites if there's a risk of injury, health or harm by storing your waste at home.. The Cuxton site (Medway Council) will be kept closed in the early phase of reopening. This is because traffic queuing for the Cuxton site at peak periods has had a severe impact on the A228 and other local. To be able to visit a HWRC you must book a slot online in advance. Please note that slots are very limited in order to maintain social distancing for staff and visitors. You will only be able to book one visit in any 4 week period per household to ensure everyone can use sites safely. #### **October in Your Garden**

'The heat of Autumn is different to the heat of Summer, one ripens apples, the other turns them to cider.'



October evenings are always shorter as the

nights draw in, and with this brings the turning of the garden as it slowly drifts into a less floral

autumnal display. It is at this point where late flowering plants come into their own, as well as the evergreen backbone of the garden which will remain through winter. Salvia, Penstemon, Dahlia and Echinacea will all continue to flower right through until the first frosts, so keep deadheading them in the meantime. Once the frost blackens the foliage, then its time to cut back all foliage, and for Dahlia & Begonia protect the tubers for winter.

There is plenty of winter bedding available such as Pansies, Violas and Cyclamen to provide pops of colour in the borders or in pots closer to the house, so there is always something of interest in the garden. October also isn't too late to plant out any new shrubs or trees, although the earlier this is done the better as its better for the plants to have time to establish

before any truly harsh winter weather arrives – we're lucky in the south as this is rarely until the new year. Shrubs that will look good throughout the winter months are Photinia (Red Robin), Cornus (Dogwood), Winter Jasmine, Sarcococca (Sweet Box) and Hellebores, and so will provide that extra interest and structure through your borders (or in pots if you have a terrace).

By now it is time to be tidying the garden by cutting back the foliage of summer perennials that don't offer any additional winter structure. Remember to leave a few stems if possible as these will provide vital habitats for overwintering beneficial bugs & insects, & the rest can all be composted to provide a useful recycled resource to go back into the garden next year.....

...... If you haven't yet started a compost heap, its never too late, and you can easily create a small heap in a corner of the garden (make sure it's on earth not paving to allow the organisms from the earth to access the heap for the decomposition process) by layering your garden cuttings with grass clippings, shredded paper and fruit & veg peelings. In less than a year it will have broken down enough to be able to be used back in the garden as a mulch or dug into your soil to improve it's structure. Continue to add to the pile thru winter and into next year as it will continue to rot down into lovely homemade compost.

It is also time to prepare to move any tender plants indoors or into the most sheltered area of the garden, so make sure the storage areas are clear ready for the move. If possible clean & disinfect the greenhouse for maximum light levels and to keep plants healthy over winter. Autumn is also the ideal time to mulch beds and borders, whilst the soil is still warm & the moisture levels have improved

Once any cutting back has been done and any obvious weeds have been removed, then place a good layer, at least 3 inches (or 8cm), of well-rotted manure, garden compost or chipped bark on top of the soil. This will help to protect the soil from erosion over the winter, whilst also enriching the soil and improving its structure. Over time the worms etc will work the organic matter into the soil, so it's a process that should be repeated each autumn. Its also great for keeping weed growth in check, and makes any weeds that do appear much easier to remove.

In the vegetable garden there is still plenty to harvest, winter veg such as Swedes, Parsnips and Cauliflower are all ready to be picked for use, Squashes should be harvested before the first frosts, but can be stored for months in a frost free shed etc. The last beetroot, beans and courgettes should also be harvested now, and can be pickled or frozen for storing through winter. Tomatoes, Peppers and Chillies will also need to be picked now and ripened indoors.

Other things to be doing in the garden now:

Update pots of summer bedding by changing for winter bedding, the old compost can be used as a mulch on the garden or added to the compost heap.

Continue to cut the lawn on a higher setting if the weather is mild.

- Give evergreen hedges a final cut to create a tidy hedge for the winter months.
- Rake up any garden leaves into black sacks punch some holes in the bag before piling the leaves in, tie the top & leave behind the shed until next year. The leaves will rot down to create leaf mould which is an excellent soil improver.
- Aerate the lawn by sinking a garden fork in as far as possible, this will help to improve drainage and also relieve the compaction from being walked on through summer.
- Also rake the lawn to remove any thatch before applying and autumn lawn treatment to help improve the lawn ready for next year.
- Net ponds to prevent leaves etc falling in as they will decompose over the winter and clog up the pond.
- Prune Roses back by one third, ideally to an outward facing bud, to help prevent wind rock. Also clear and dispose of any fallen leaves to prevent any chance of black spot overwintering in the ground then mulch well around the base.
