CHURCH OF ENGLAND WORSHIP

REV'D MIKE HAYES



Dear friends

What would Jesus say about the Wall of Prayer being built near to a motorway in the Midlands? 169' high, more than twice as tall as the Angel of the North, visible from 6 miles away, on a green field site and costing £9.35m being raised through crowd funding.

The builders of the 'Eternal Wall of Answered Prayer' say that it is to preserve our nation's Christian heritage. Each brick will tell a story of answered prayer. Visitors will be able to scan each brick to hear the story. They say that entrance will be free but that the expected operating profits from the car park, café and bookshop will generate annually £400,000 a year which will raise money for charity.

How does God answer prayers? A leader of the project states that they are more interested in the journey of prayer than the answers.

That's certainly where I would stand. I think that followers of Jesus offer prayer as much as we can. Sometimes it's a prayer of asking, sometimes a prayer of thanksgiving, sometimes a prayer for guidance, sometimes expressing anger or sorrow and processing those feelings, sometimes simply being silent as we consciously place ourselves in the presence of God. The answers are not always the ones we expect or want, though. More than anything else they may lead us in to a deeper knowledge of being close to God whatever happens.

The Wall is a work of art which encourages people to reflect and question. But the reflection and questioning starts from a Christian viewpoint. I speak from a Christian tradition which I hold on to firmly. However I would love to see an installation that explored a multi-faith perspective on prayer. I speak also as someone who has Jewish relations by marriage, a family member who is a Buddhist, and some friends who are Muslims. This country has a heritage and is full of beautiful expressions of Christian faith in the form of buildings, of which Wouldham Church is a fine example.

However Jesus' teaching was that his followers should witness to him by loving actions and by working for justice and peace. I'm not sure that building on another green field and encouraging more car journeys to a tourist attraction has got very much to do with this.

Let's encourage prayer, let's do so in a way which acknowledges our sisters and brothers in all faiths, and let's rebuild our nation's Christian heritage by working for a caring and compassionate society which works in harmony with nature.

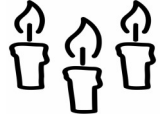

For 218 years the tower at All Saints Church in Wouldham has been surmounted by a fine iron weather vane. Witness to the changing climate, seven monarchs, Walter Burke and the Battle of Trafalgar, two world wars, the changing valley seen, the building of new bridges and now a new village. Sadly after more than 200 years it is in need of urgent restoration. BURHAM UNITED CHARITIES

Nitrous Oxide Laughing Gas

In January 2020, the HSE warned young people through the mainstream media of the risks associated with using Nitrous Oxide 'laughing Gas' due to the increase in use within communities and at music festivals in 2019.

Soon to be published data from HSE and Trinity College Dublin in relation to drug trends last Summer at music festivals indicates that over a quarter of respondents to the survey had used Nitrous Oxide.

Nitrous Oxide is a depressant/dissociative/inhalant type drug and is also known as Laughing Gas.

Whippets (cartridges of nitrous oxide), whippet. Chargers. Bulbs. NoS, N2O, balloons, hippee crack.

The gas has a number of industrial uses and is used clinically as an anaesthetic gas for pain relieving properties when mixed with air.

It is colourless gas and some say is slightly sweet smelling and tasting. It can be found in different forms such as whipped cream chargers 'whippets' which are small silver cartridges. It can also come as crackers with balloons attached or as balloons that have been filled with gas.

If it is inhaled this is sometimes referred to as nagging.

Some of the effects of using this drug after 10-30 seconds are:

- People feel euphoric, giddy and want to giggle.
- Some feel relaxed and calm.
- Some people may get a headache,

dizziness or blurred vision.

- Loss of balance and feeling unsteady or disorientation.
- Irritated respiratory tract – the part that helps a person breath.
- Short lived paranoia.
- It can cause a change in blood pressure for some people or sudden death due to lack of oxygen.

Some of the Long term effects:

- Mood changes and depression.
- People with heart blood pressure or mental health concerns could be at greater risk. Nitrous Oxide can cause a drop in oxygen levels which increase heart rate.
- Inhaling directly from the canister can damage the throat and lungs.
- Risk of falling or accidents after use.
- People have died from suffocation or lack of oxygen.

Educating young people

Parents play an important role in educating young people of the risks associated with drug and alcohol use.

To help parents discuss substance use the HSE have produced a booklet to guide the conversation. You can down load HSE Parents Guide.

You will then get the facts and reduce the harm to your children who may be involved in taking these drugs.

Whilst we are aware of problems along New Court Rd in particular, I have been advised by the Police that during the period 1 June to 25 September, only four reports were logged with Kent Police, which does not show the true picture. United Charities of the Ancient Parish of Burham

Winter Fuel Grant 2020

Applications for grants towards the costs of winter fuel bills are invited from residents of the Ancient Parish of Burham.

To qualify for assistance applicants should be aged 65 years or over and have lived within the boundaries of the Ancient Parish for the past 10 years.

The weekly HOUSEHOLD income of applicants, i.e. the total income from all occupants, must not exceed £275 for single occupancy or £350 for multiple occupancy. For this purpose, income is determined after deducting half of rent payable (rent after deducting any housing benefit received) and ignoring attendance allowance and similar state benefits and credits. Only one application per household will be considered. The Trustees reserve the right to make such enquiries as they believe necessary to confirm entitlement to the grant.

DOG WARDEN

The TMBC dog warden and waste control came to the village to “bag and flag” any dog poo they found on the Rec and on the grass by the village sign. They bagged 22 lots on the Rec and 9 elsewhere. Keep Britain Tidy website:

Dog mess is the most unacceptable and offensive type of litter on our streets. Our research tells us that dog fouling is the issue the public are most concerned about.

Dog fouling is not only deeply unpleasant, it is dangerous. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis – a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness or seizures.

It's no wonder dog fouling is such a problem – there are estimated to be more than 8 million dogs producing more than 1,000 tonnes of mess every day in the UK alone.

While most dog owners are caring, responsible individuals, there are still some people who do not clean up after their pets.

Anyone who fails to clear up after their dog can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice of up to £100. If the case goes to court this could cost the owner or person in charge of the animal up to £1,000.

The Parish Council will not hesitate to report offenders with use of the CCTV in the Recreation Ground

TRAFFIC SURVEYS

The PC have conducted another traffic survey, this is the 4th annual survey we have conducted since 2016. It shows that volumes of traffic have increased from 6345 vehicles per week to 24554 vehicles going through the village weekly. HGV's going through the village have also increased considerably.

Speeds of vehicles going through the village have been measured as: 21mph as a daily mean average. As an example of one weekday: average daily speed 20.8mph, total vehicles 3374 of which 70% were driving at 19-25mph and 9% were driving over 25mph, the further 21% were driving below 19mph. Speedwatch have noted that many people caught speeding by them in the village are residents.

KCC have put a plan into consultation for traffic calming in the village for the Strategic Highways committee to comment on, they have asked the PC for their comments.

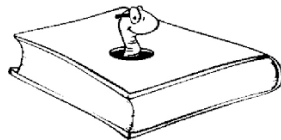

NOVEMBER in Your Garden

*'November comes & November goes, with the last red berries, and the first white snows.
With night coming early, & dawn coming late, Ice in the bucket & frost by the gate.
The fire burns, & the kettle sings, and earth sinks to rest, until next Spring.'*

November always brings that cosy feeling with it, where nothing is better than a hot toddy by a roaring fire, made even better if it's coupled with an autumnal walk kicking through the fallen leaves. It's sometimes a little more difficult to get out in the garden once the days are shorter, but if the weather is agreeable & you have the chance it will always be beneficial to both mind & body.

By November most spring flowering bulbs should have been planted, but November is recommended as the best month for planting Tulip bulbs as the cold weather minimises the risk for disease, & early in the month will still be ok for planting up other spring flowering bulbs such as Narcissi & Iris. You can make some really cheery displays clustering pots together with spring bulbs in, or by creating a 'bulb lasagne' in larger pots. To do this, use a large pot, and layer bigger bulbs near the bottom & work up to the smaller sized bulbs, keep a layer of compost between each layer & don't let the individual bulbs touch. A stunning display can be created by colour co-ordinating your choice of bulbs in each pot.

Late autumn is ideal to get the last bits of tidying done around the garden as over the next few months there are fewer opportunities to get out into the garden. So make sure any weed seedlings are cleared, do the last lawn trim on a high setting, rake up any last leaves (these can also be shredded by running over with a mower which helps the leaves to break down quicker in the compost heap!), empty summer bedding pots & use to pot up winter bedding, float a tennis ball on ponds to keep an air hole in freezing temps, cut back any last perennial growth & add to the compost heap. Give the lawn edge a last trim & tidy any straggly growth on hedges, it's also a good time to aerate the lawn by spiking over it with a garden fork – simply push the fork into the ground and wiggle it a little to create air holes, space them approx 1m apart in each direction. These can either be left as holes or brush in a mix of sand and compost to improve drainage.

Also check nest boxes and bug hotels to make sure they're clean and sturdy ready for their winter & spring inhabitants. You can also use autumn clippings to create a ground heap for use by insects that hibernate at ground level, or for local hedgehogs to use to create a nest – they tend to create a small burrow which is then covered with garden material such as leaves and twigs to make a cosy nest. With hedgehogs now on the 'in danger of extinction' list it is important that we do all we can to help these garden friends as loss of habitat has contributed to their decline.

So don't feel the need to tidy every corner of the garden for winter as it's often the less perfect areas that they will find ideal for hibernation. If you are lucky enough to have a visiting hedgehog then you can also leave out cat food and water for them during November to make sure they have enough fat reserves to survive hibernation (place it under a slab raised on a brick so that they can get in but the resident cats can't!!). If you see a hedgehog out during the day, or that looks small then contact our local hedgehog rescue.

In the vegetable garden, continue to harvest winter root veg such as carrots, parsnips, turnips & leeks, and brassicas such as cabbage, caulis & Brussel Sprouts and check that these are firmly rooted for winter winds, if in doubt stake them to avoid them being damaged & keep them netted to protect from hungry pigeons. November is also ideal for planting out garlic, shallots & winter onion sets, these can just be pushed into soft ground until just their tips are showing. Keep the planting area well weeded over winter ready for their main growth spurt in spring. Broad beans can also be sown direct now, but protect young growth from snails and hungry pigeons

Other things to be doing in the garden now:

Make sure all last tender perennials have been cut back & moved to a protected area such as greenhouse or shed, or have been covered or wrapped with bubble wrap for protection.

Raise garden pots off the ground if poss., & remove any water trays so they're not sitting in the wet.

Keep bird feeders and baths topped up, and defrost in freezing temperature.

Prune Apple or Pear trees now by taken out the 3 D's (dead/diseased/damaged), & remove any wispy growth too.

Cut back any remaining tomato plants now & add to the compost heap.

Cut back autumn flowering raspberries to the ground once they have finished cropping.

Move outdoor herb pots into the greenhouse/shed to keep them producing a little longer. Harvest any remaining basil, but also take a few cuttings & place in a glass of water until roots appear. Then pot up & keep on a sunny windowsill over winter for fresh basil.
