

Cllr Dalton was elected Chairman at the April meeting, with Cllr Stead as Vice-Chairman. Both accepted the posts.

The new website is now up and running. Although it is a new website, the domain name of burhampc.kentparishes.gov.uk remains unchanged.

The Windmill Public house planning application TM/21/00575 has been withdrawn. It is not known if another application will be submitted or not. The Parish Council will be re- submitting a Community Asset listing with TMBC, when the original runs out in July 2021.

We still waiting further advice from TMBC regarding the Saturday bulky refuse service. Update information is due from TMBC during June (but too late to include with this edition).

As a reminder, there is now a clothing recycling bank at the recycling site. This like the cardboard/paper bank general funds for us, so if you have clothes that are no longer needed, this is the ideal place to dispose of them.

By the time this edition is circulated, the new 5 year lease with Trenport for Court Meadow should be in place, under the same terms as previous. Also an additional gate into Court Meadow is in the process of being installed.

The new basketball hoops have been fitted. Arrangements are also in place to have the four benches and the bin in the children's play area re-painted.

The War memorial will be 100 years old in October and so we are looking if a rededication of the war memorial could be arranged around that time. Further details to follow.

NEW WEBSITE: Wouldhampc.com

Our last meeting was on May 4th via Zoom, we are hoping our next meeting will be on June 1st in the hall but are waiting for the covid information on May 17th before we make the decision.

AGM

The PC held their AGM in May. Eddy Bell was re-elected Chair and Adam Baker was elected Vice Chair. Congratulations to Andrew Kennedy who is our new Kent County Councillor. It is good for us that he lives in Wouldham, we look forward to working with him.

PLANNING

The Parish Council have a planning committee who look at all the applications that are relevant to Wouldham and object or comment where they feel that is helpful. Trenport are planning yet more housing and we are waiting for their pre-application with TMBC before being able to respond. There are 2 sites in the village that they want to build flats on. The PC have objected to both and we will keep you informed. Unfortunately constraints have been placed on TMBC by Central Government which has meant that it is currently severely limited in it's ability to control housing development. A detailed report explaining this planning matter, submitted to WPC, can be seen on WPC website www.wouldhampc.com in 'documents relating to May 21 Council Meeting'

NEW VILLAGE HALL

As we reported last month, Trenport have refused us permission to put a new hall on the Recreation Ground, we applied to build it on the only area the PC own (that Trenport cannot refuse us permission for), which is on the car park. At the moment we have had to withdraw this application for a consultant report, another delay but we will persevere.

HIGHWAYS IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Kent County Council Highways Department ask Parish Councils to submit a Highways Improvement Plan (HIP) annually for their area. This year we have submitted for 20mph levels in Peters Village, some signs and a change of priority for School Lane/Oldfield Drive.

Last year the Parish Council requested a zebra crossing on Knowle Road, this was refused but as a result the PC have agreed to fund the lollipop lady for a year.

The PC have discussed adding more parking in the recreation ground, our decision is to wait for the planning permission for the new hall to be agreed before deciding where we can add some.

JUNE in Your Garden

'The hum of bees is the voice of the garden.'
Before we know it mid-summer is upon us, with the longest day just a few weeks away. The cold weather through to April has made way for warmer weather now, which hopefully means everyone has had time to enjoy their gardens.

Current conditions have meant that many of us are also using our gardens for entertaining, highlighting the different aspects of our gardens, whether that's seating, lighting or overall design. Keep these things in mind (or note them on a piece of paper) when planning any changes to your garden environment over the summer and it will help to make your garden more functional, as well as beautiful, over the coming months.

By now gardens are in full flow, with perennial plants such as Geranium, Roses, Lilies, Peonies, Lupins and Euphorbia all creating colour and form within the garden. Height and density are as equally important in beds and borders, as colour and texture.

By planning the perennial planting together with shrubs and evergreens it will maintain a flow of colour through the seasons whilst creating structure within the beds themselves. Some great shrubs for June are Weigelia, Spirea, Hebe, Philadelphus & Choisya – these can all be trimmed or cut back after flowering & will put on new growth ready for the next season.

Hedges are able to be cut now as nesting birds should have fledged by now – but do check first to be sure. It's so enjoyable seeing birds and

wildlife enjoying the garden, & by encouraging a range of wildlife into your green space it will create a wide bio-diversity within your garden which will mean a more natural way to manage pests. Introducing a pond, even just a small pot of water, will increase the range of wildlife visiting your garden too.

June is also an incredibly productive time in the vegetable garden. It's time to sow Runner Beans, French beans, Sweetcorn, Courgettes and Cucumbers, & also time to move Tomatoes, Chillies and Squashes to their final growing position or into grow bags in a sunny location for maximum cropping.



If you have no room left in the borders but fancy trying some home-grown produce, then all of the above can be grown in pots on a sunny veranda, as long as they are watered and fed regularly.

Soft fruit and berries will also be coming into season now, with Strawberries, Raspberries and Blueberries all leading the way into



summer – and one of the best things on this earth is a freshly picked home- grown strawberry – but be vigilant as hungry birds will soon make a feast of your berries when they are at their peak ripeness. By covering them with some net or fleece (& make sure its secured at the bottom too), you should prevent your crops from being pinched!! You can also continue to sow salads, radishes, carrot, spring onions and

peas for a continuous crop.

Remember it's also possible to include edibles into your garden beds too, with salads coming in a range of colours, & beans and peas able to add height. Feeding all vegetable plants through the summer, as well as keeping them well watered will encourage healthy crops further down the line. This is particularly important if you are growing your fruit & veg in pots as in the warm weather they dry out even quicker.

Other things to be doing in the garden now:

Mow lawns regularly to encourage strong growth, but resist the urge to water it in dry spells as water is a valuable resource best saved for pots & baskets – the lawn will soon recover once it rains.

Keep dead-heading faded flowers from any annuals or perennials to encourage the plants to continue to flower. Simply pinch or cut the flower head off, taking it back to the nearest pair of leaves.

Fill pots & baskets with annuals such as Pelargonium, Begonia, Petunias, Lobelia etc. to create summer displays and to add additional colour where required. These can also be planted directly into beds and borders, or the pots placed in spaces in the borders too.

Dahlia, Canna and other tender perennials can also be moved outside and placed in a sunny spot. Keep watering and feeding them to encourage them to into strong growth to flower all summer long.

When watering pots or baskets (or the garden), make sure to water the soil not the leaves. Get under the leaves as much as possible to make sure the soil gets wet otherwise water will just evaporate from the leaves and the plant will remain thirsty – its best to water really well a couple of times a week than just giving it a quick go every day. Also ensure that feed is directed to the roots and not the leaves, you can use a general purpose dilutable feed in with your watering, or sprinkle granular feed around the base of plants and in pots, or use slow release pellets which will release nutrients over a longer length of time & reduce the need for regular feeding.

If you haven't already done so, you can Chelsea Chop some of your perennial plants to encourage later blooms and also a prolonged season of blooms.

This can be done on Geranium, Phlox,
Echinacea, Rudbeckia and many others.

Keep bird bath's and feeders topped up as they will be busy feeding their young and teaching them the ways of the outside world.
