Dear Friends,

I would like to draw your attention to two services offered by the church.

Firstly, Home Blessings.

Moving into a new home is a big event. It may be a first home, or perhaps a larger home, or possibly downsizing. It may be a rented home, or a home that you own, or it may be a home in sheltered housing or in a care home.

To help with these transitions the church offers a Service of Blessing. This consists of a prayer of thanksgiving and an acknowledgement that God lives among us, and a bible reading, and then a prayer of blessing for each room of the house. Where there are children they can be

involved in appropriate ways. The service lasts for about 15 minutes and concludes with a prayer for all who live in the house and all who will be welcomed into it.

This is offered to those who are churchgoers and those who are not, you only have to ask, and if you want to know more about this you can contact me.

Secondly, Ministry of Healing.

Prayers for healing of mind and body have always been an important part of the Christian faith and the church is glad to offer these. They consist of the Laying on of hands with prayer, which is done by the minister together with another church member, and also the Anointing of the Sick, where oil blessed by our Bishop in the cathedral is used to make the sign of the cross on the person asking for healing.

In this parish these are usually done after the church service in the side chapel, and family members and friends can also be present. We offer these prayers at the onset of an illness, or to help manage an ongoing health issue.

Many people derive great strength from these prayers, and when we pray we always bring to God our hopes and fears, and ask for healing, but the prayers are also for grace and strength whatever the outcome, and for trust in God's loving purposes for us.

You can also request prayers to be said by the prayer group on your behalf at the weekly Candle Prayers, and people are often encouraged and strengthened by knowing that they are being prayed for.

Please feel free to be in touch about any of the above.



Job title: Emergency Care Support Worker

When did you start this role?

2016, however I have been with the ambulance service since 2014.

What qualifications do you need to perform this role?

It's changed since I started but now, I believe it's an apprenticeship over 13 months with a mix of classroom and learning out on the road. Official qualifications needed are GCSE or equivalent in Maths and English at C or grade 4. Along with a C1 driving licence and full driving licence for at least 1 year.

What attracted you to this position?

When I left school I studied Beauty Therapy at college, which I loved, but I took more interest in the anatomy and physiology side. I then left and went to another college to complete a Diploma in A Health Professions pathway, including human biology, etc. As I was completing my course, I came across a job opportunity working for South East Coast Ambulance Service and here I am!

What is your favourite part of the job?

The adrenaline on the way to jobs, not knowing what you are going to walk into. Making a difference to someone's life or even just their day. Welcoming babies into the world and hiding the relief on our faces when the midwives arrive!

And the least?

Telling a family that a relative you tried to save has passed away. Even though we do everything we can for them but feeling like we've failed. One of the biggest ones we deal with unfortunately is time wasters, and being verbally and physically abused by members of the public which is guaranteed at least once a shift!

What is a typical day like for you?

Preparing our vehicle for the day, getting the radio on a good channel and singing most of the day working alongside my best friend too! (I'm very lucky). Spending our day in and out of patients' houses or hospitals and hoping that we don't get sent out of area at the end of our shifts.

New Court Road

July in Your Garden

Relax and enjoy the hard work you have put in over the last few months but remember to leave low dishes of water out for the wildlife. Gather some seeds from the flowers you have and share them with neighbours to enhance our village even more.

From late July the risks of blight increase, dependant as it is upon the combination of high humidity and warm days and nights. The best defence for outdoor tomatoes is good ventilation and stripping off the lower leaves as the fruits develop helps this, as well as helping the ripening tomatoes have maximum exposure to sun.

Lawn Cutting Service: funded by Richard Watts Charities (RWC) for older or disabled people who are unable to cut the lawn themselves.

Grants and Services: Grants and free services are awarded to people who are financially eligible.

Household Essential Grants: for essential items such as clothing, cookers or fridges for people of any age group.

Out Pension Grant: a top-up payment of £15 per week can be made to retired applicants. Our pensions are paid directly into bank or building society accounts every four weeks. Continued ...

Educational Grants: for items associated with education or training, e.g. books, equipment, uniforms, special needs arrangements, music, or outings.

Apprenticeship Grants: apprenticeship grants of up to £100 are available to new apprentices under the age of 25 with confirmed apprenticeships.

Home Help Service: the Home Help Service provides assistance to people at home and in the local community. It includes housework, shopping and laundry but does not personal care. The charge is currently £12.50 per hour unless a free service is awarded.

Medway Telecare Service (formerly Lifeline); is provided by Kyndi but eligible people can apply to RWC for funding.
