Job title: Rector of Burham and Wouldham

When did you start this role?

I was ordained Priest in 1979. I worked in inner London parishes, and also in prison and hospital chaplaincy. I started in this parish in 2012

What qualifications do you need to perform this role?

Ministerial Training which usually includes a theology degree and some pastoral training as well as a long period of discernment about suitability.

What attracted you to this position?

I was retiring from a post as Hospice Chaplain and felt called to return to parish ministry. This semi-rural parish was a new challenge.

What is your favourite part of the job?

Two things really. Presiding at the Eucharist which is the central act of Christian worship and meeting such a huge variety of people at different stages of their lives; from the very young to those at the end of their lives, through conducting baptisms, weddings, funerals, worship in church and school, and supporting and encouraging people on their journey of faith, and they help me as well.

And the least? Administration.

What is a typical day like for you?

I never know what a day will bring. From bees swarming across the church path just before a wedding, to learning the Gregorian chant for the dawn Easter service the variety is mind-stretching which is probably good for me!

What advice would you give to someone thinking of this position as a career?

You need to have a desire to serve and feel called by God, and the Church of England needs to agree that you have a calling and we do this following a lengthy process, and then the training takes years. You need good listening skills and a sense of humour.

Village Hall roof

It is hoped that the new Village Hall roof (including solar panels) project will commence mid July, after major delays due to Covid and funding.

Outstanding Trenport Planning Applications

At the time of being produced, there was no news from TMBC regarding the outstanding Trenport planning applications, including Bell Lane, Peters Village Southern Extension, or the land at Eccles development. Also, over the coming months, chalk storage will be taking place on the Southern Extension area which currently is being stored in two areas in Peters Village.

Car Parks

As a reminder, all vehicles using the Parish Council owned car parks (Bell Lane, Church Street, Village Hall, and overflow at Village Hall) must be fully taxed, MOT'd and insured, and in a road worthy condition. SORN, or vehicles with no MOT, tax, or insurance are not permitted. Camper vans/Mobile homes or similar types of vehicles are also not permitted. Vehicles must also not be stored in the car parks if they have broken down. Vehicles are monitored and checked. Also, please ensure that you park "pretty" taking into account, double yellow lines, dropped kerbs, disabled bays and parking aby lines and other vehicles. Even the Village Hall overflow car park is getting very busy at times.

Anti-social behaviour

Buses

As I am sure you are all aware, Nu-Venture are operating a very slim Tuesday and Thursday service for the residents of Burham and the local area. This may well change over the coming months. If we are advised of any updates, we will of course keep you informed.

Church street one way

A site meeting took place with KCC Highways regarding the <u>feasibility</u> of having Church Street one way. (We have previously been advised that part one way is not possible as a highway turning area is required). KCC Highways are drawing up plans for the Parish Council to view and these are due shortly. This is the first stage of any <u>potential project</u> and any costs will need to be met by ourselves.

Cardboard recycling

As DS Smith our cardboard recycling company has increased the exchange bank rate from May, it is more important that residents ensure that they break down any large boxes etc to make the best possible use of space. The exchange bank is only requested when the bank is completely full, with the contents being shuffled around at least three times, before the call is made to DS Smith. If the bank is full and this goes for all the recycling banks, please do not leave your recycling outside the banks, as this is officially classed as fly tipping. Please take it home and check in a few days time.

Clothing Banks

The two clothing banks also generates funds. Whilst other items can be recycled, it is only the clothes and the textiles that we receive payment for.

June in Your Garden

'It was June and the world smelled of Roses. The sunshine was like powdered gold over a grassy hillside'

As we move into June, and long warm days and balmy evenings are upon us, it truly is the time to be enjoying the garden and the efforts of the hard work in previous months to bring the garden through to its summer splendour. Make time to enjoy the garden, ignore the jobs that need doing and sit in the warmth of the sun and take in natures wonder around you.

With Chelsea Flower Show being televised in May (or you may have been lucky enough to visit), it often spurs ideas and inspiration for our own gardens, whether it's the transformation of a seating area, or the introduction of a 'picking patch,' or how to use sculpture in your garden, there is usually plenty of scope to adapt them to suit our own spaces. One of the key elements of any garden is design, particularly for a show garden, but even in our own modest spaces. With gardens getting smaller, functionality is ever more important, so look at clever ways to create a multifunction dining or play space. Privacy may also be of importance, and the introduction of a slender tree or a cleverly placed shrub can often create the right effect whilst also bringing wildlife into the garden. They will also help to lower temperatures on warm days and help to dissipate noise if you are near a road or have noisy neighbours. For year round interest then Ligustrum, Holly or Amelanchier are all excellent choices.

In the rest of the garden, if you observed 'No Mow May', then now is the time to get back to regularly cutting the lawn, or not if you have decided that you quite enjoy the additional wild flowers and the insects they attract. You can also prune spring flowering shrubs such as Photinia and Forsythia to tidy them back into shape and to stop them getting too big. Tender plants such as Dahlia, Canna, and Citrus trees can all be moved outside now for the summer and planted in borders or pots as you prefer. Summer bedding such as Pelargonium, Busy Lizzies, and Petunia can all be planted out into pots, baskets, and borders too. I'm hoping to theme mine in red, white, and blue this year as part of the Jubilee celebrations! In the veg garden, by now strawberries and currents will be fruiting. Protect strawberries from water splashes by placing a bed of straw around the plant; this will keep the fruit off the ground and help to prevent them rotting. Pick them regularly to encourage more flowers and fruits. Berries should be covered with some netting or fleece – making sure it's taut to prevent birds getting caught in it and also secured at ground level – as this will protect the fruit from hungry birds. Summer crops such as tomatoes, chillies, aubergine, squashes and courgettes can be planted out into the ground or into bigger pots or grow bags, and beans, peas sweetcorn, leeks and salads can all be sown outside directly into the ground or into pots for harvesting later.

Carrots, parsnips and beetroot can also be direct sown for successional crops over the next month – if you sow a small row every couple of weeks it will ensure you have enough, but not too much, to harvest each time.

Other things to be doing in the garden now:

- * Start dead-heading summer blooms especially in baskets and pots to keep promoting more flowers.
- * Support taller plants: inserting stakes, canes or supports early will make this easier.
- * Water vigilantly; pots and baskets will dry out quickly in warm weather so need watering every day to ensure they don't dry out.
- * Keep bird feeders topped up as birds will be busy nesting at this time, and make sure there is fresh water in the bird bath too.

Lawn Cutting Service: funded by Richard Watts Charities (RWC) for older or disabled people who are unable to cut the lawn themselves.

<u>Grants and Services</u>: Grants and free services are awarded to people who are financially eligible.

Household Essential Grants: for essential items such as clothing, cookers or fridges for people of any age group.

Out Pension Grant: a top-up payment of £15 per week can be made to retired applicants. Our pensions are paid directly into bank or building society accounts every four weeks.

Educational Grants: for items associated with education or training, e.g. books, equipment, uniforms, special needs arrangements, music, or outings.

Apprenticeship Grants: apprenticeship grants of up to £100 are available to new apprentices under the age of 25 with confirmed apprenticeships.
