Our church supports food banks, but they should be a temporary measure when people need help due to a change of circumstances. It's immoral that they become a regular necessity in a society which has so much wealth.

If we ever were a Christian society we are not now. In the Lord's Prayer we ask that God's kingdom will come on earth.

And God will bless the efforts of those who work for that.



Winter Fuel Grant 2022

Applications for grants towards the costs of winter fuel bills are invited from residents of the Ancient Parish of Burham.

To qualify for assistance applicants should be aged 65 years or over and have lived within the boundaries of the Ancient Parish for the past 10 years. The weekly HOUSEHOLD income of applicants, i.e. the total income from all occupants, must not exceed £300 for single occupancy or £400 for multiple occupancy. For this purpose, income is determined after deducting half of rent payable (rent after deducting any housing benefit received) and ignoring attendance allowance and similar state benefits and credits. Only one application per household will be considered. The Trustees reserve the right to make such enquiries as they believe necessary to confirm entitlement to the grant.

A day in the life of... Sue Hanson Job title: Florist/Business owner Director of a Limited Company; Just Peachy Florist

When did you start this role? I have worked as a Florist for many years.

What qualifications do you need to perform this role?

You don't have to have a formal qualification to become a florist, you can be self-taught, of you can choose to take a college qualification. You need a love of flowers, a creative eye, and attention to detail. You need to learn the names of flowers, when flowers are in season, and the basic forms of flowers. You also need good and friendly communication skills.

What attracted you to this position?

The love of flowers and the especially the enjoyment of creating Wedding flowers and funeral flowers.

What is your favourite part of the job?

Visiting Wedding Venues and setting up the flowers and delivering bouquets to the Brides.

And the least?

Emptying dirty water and bleaching buckets.

What is a typical day like for you?

Checking the Diary, checking Website and Direct 2 Florist Orders, ordering flowers on the Dutch Markets, conditioning flowers, making arrangements, delivering the orders, speaking to customers on the phone, consultations with Brides to discuss their wedding flowers. Typing Wedding Quotations, replying to emails, administration, and bank reconciliation ... the list goes on.

What advice would you give to someone thinking of this position as a career?

You cannot be afraid of hard work; Floristry isn't always as glamorous as people think. It involves lots of dirty water and bleaching buckets, early mornings, lots of standing all day, working in the cold, conditioning flowers, dirty fingernails.

You must have patience when speaking to customers, and you need to be able to adapt to different circumstances quickly, one customer could be sending flowers for the birth of a baby and the next customer may want to send funeral flowers for a loved one and they can be extremely upset.

Can you share the funniest, embarrassing or most memorable story? Over 20 years ago I worked in a flower shop and my now husband was a Funeral Director. At the time we were not together but we knew each other. Warren had been helping a client; an elderly lady whose brother had passed away. When the brother was alive each week he bought the elderly lady 9 Peach Roses to put in a vase so Warren suggested to her a Tied Sheath of 9 Peach Roses to lay on top of the coffin. So, Warren ordered the Peach Rose Sheath with me through the shop. On the morning of the funeral there was a mix-up and the flowers did arrive, but they were very late. Poor Warren called the shop in a panic as he was waiting to go onto the funeral.

The following day I called Warren to apologise and to check the elderly lady was okay. Warren said that he managed to get to the funeral on time with the flowers and the elderly lady was very happy and was not aware there had been a delay with the flowers.

Warren then said to me "while you are on the phone would you like to come out on a date with me?" And so we went on a date and 20 years on we are married and Warren buys me Peach Roses every Anniversary. I even had Peach Roses in my Bridal Bouquet, and hence I called my business Just Peachy and my logo is a Peach Rose. It may be a cheesy story but it is true!



How would you rate job satisfaction out of 10?

10, I love it! I love to see the look on Bride's faces when I arrive with their bouquets, or to make a family happy when they are grieving because the funeral tributes are so beautiful. Seeing the smile on peoples faces when they answer the front door to you and you hand them a beautiful gift bouquet is just wonderful!

One way system on Church Street

One way system Church Street from Rochester Rd to New Court Rd has been delayed/postponed. Since the agreed date was advised, KCC have now provided us with different information, so we need to clarify the processes and procedures from them before any further action can be taken.

Rochester Road resurfacing

Whilst the resurfacing to Rochester Rd took place late July, many of the road markings including double yellow lines were not reinstalled until much later. It took several attempts for the contractors to get the road marking right – hopefully they have all been addressed by now.

Recycling Sites

TMBC have made the decision to remove a further 10 recycling sites across the Borough, as the kerb side collection has made substantial decrease in use of these sites. Burham's recycling site will not be affected and remains 1 of 10 remaining. **Please use the site or lose it**. The site contains the following banks: paper/cardboard, plastics, cans, all glass, clothing and textiles. Also, it's been confirmed that the free of charge Saturday bulky refuse service will not be reinstated.

After closing down for the school summer holidays and allowing the contractors to remove the old roofing materials and replace with new, Burham Village Hall is now fully open for regular hires including Burham Pre-School and many others. The hall has always been popular with casual bookings at the weekend and this can now continue.

The important project which ensures the safe use of Burham Village Hall was funded by a £46,616.92 grant from FCC Communities Foundation.

David Young, Chair of Burham Village Hall Management Committee is delighted that the Village Hall is now in full use with a new water-tight roof and said "This vital facility is important to all those who use it, as well as the wider East Bank of the Medway community. Grants and Services: Grants and free services are awarded to people who are financially eligible.

Out Pension Grant: a top-up payment of £15 per week can be made to retired applicants. Our pensions are paid directly into bank or building society accounts every four weeks.

November in Your Garden

'Delicious Autumn! My very soul is wedded to it, & if I were a bird I would fly about the earth seeking the successive autumns.'

November starts with such a fanfare, All Hallows Eve, followed by bonfire night, sparks the season of cosy nights in by the fire. This all follows the bright vibrant colour that adorns our native (& non-native) trees through Autumn as the russets, bronze and gold of the leaves shed from their trees and fall to the ground in a crisp colourful layer. It always is such a sight to behold.

In the garden, the shorter, cooler days mean there are fewer opportunities to get out into the garden. The weather can affect what jobs need doing, as if it stays mild the lawns will still need cutting, and weeds will continue to grow so will need tidying. If frost is forecast, then ensure you bring any tender plants indoors (a shed or greenhouse will often suffice) or move to a sheltered spot for the winter.

If you are so inclined and prefer your outdoor space to look neat for winter, then you can continue to deadhead and cut back herbaceous perennials that have finished flowering for the year. However it is considered extremely beneficial to birds, hedgehogs and insects if the garden tidy up is left until spring, as flower heads and plant litter create really useful habitats for their hibernation. It is however best to cut back Roses now, by approx. $1/3^{rd}$ to an outward facing bud; this will help to prevent them from getting rocked by stormy weather. At the same time have a good clear up of any dropped leaves as these can often harbour rose black spot if left until next year. Also if you have evergreen plants or shrubs such as Cornus or Callicarpa that are grown for their winter stems, perhaps clear around them just so they stand out in your winter garden.

In the vegetable garden, continue to harvest your winter veg crops such as cabbages, carrots, parsnips, turnips, Brussel sprouts and leeks. It's also time to plant out garlic and onions as these will happily over winter in the ground.

Other things to be doing in the garden now:

* Finish pruning Lavender, by cutting back to remove the flower heads. Lavender can often be rejuvenated by cutting back harder; especially if there are new shoots emerging from the base.

- * Plant Tulip bulbs, either layered in pots or into the borders.
- * Continue to rake up leaves, & either store to make leaf mould or dispose of accordingly.
- * Put away or cover your garden furniture to protect it from the winter weather & clean out water butts ready for refilling over winter.
- * Continue to water pots and baskets through until the frosts as they will still dry out quickly on warm windy days.
- * Start to top up bird feeders and baths now that their natural food supply will be declining.
- * Refresh summer bedding now for autumn pansies and cyclamen and spread the spent compost onto the borders.
