



Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council Safer Neighbourhood Team

Report for 6 May to 31 May 2026



The Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) Team employed by TMS Protection Ltd through Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council have started positively and have been providing high visibility patrols across the borough.

They are tasked to go to hotspot locations by TMBC (based on information received from the Parish Council or from information received from residents to the ASB Officer at TMBC) and they then provide feedback through daily reports to let us know when they have visited these locations and what (if any) issues they found. They will go to the Parish Council areas that are funding the scheme on at least a weekly basis.

We hold weekly meetings with TMS to ensure that they are aware of the key locations for the week ahead and to share any relevant information.

Visits to Wouldham May 2026

Date/time (if given)	Location	Number of engagements	Any further actions taken
14/05/26	<p>Patrolled round the village and went into Peter's dental village to see if they've had any issues but nothing to report as. We then went over into the village hall but there was nothing to report as there was a dance class going on. we then went into co-op where we bumped into a lady who is a clerk of the local council and reported to us that there's been issues with drug dealing under the bridge near the river walk as well as the flats nearby, she also mentioned about youth using catapults on animals and people on bikes and quad bikes speeding around the area. During the conversation she spoke about an event at the hall on the 28th and had requested if myself and Rikki to be around the area. We patrolled around the village to see the bridge/Flat area and couldn't find the place that Tina mentioned. There were no other issues throughout our patrol.</p>		
20/05/26	<p>A general high-visibility patrol was conducted throughout the area. No significant incidents of ASB were observed during the patrol. The area was generally calm, with normal pedestrian and vehicle activity noted. Community Engagement Brief interaction took place with local residents/members of the public where appropriate. Reassurance patrol presence provided. No immediate concerns were raised at the time of patrol.</p>		
22/05/26	<p>We carried out a patrol around the Peters Village Community Centre, surrounding residential areas, and the local park. During the foot patrol of the park area, several young children, believed to be around 10 years old or younger, were present playing. No anti-social behaviour or issues were observed at that time. Patrols then</p>		



	<p>continued through Peters Village and into the local Co-op store, where officers spoke with the store manager, Michelle. She reported ongoing issues involving two teenage males described as IC1, one with ginger hair and the other with brunette hair. According to Michelle, both youths have previously been banned from the store due to repeated anti-social behaviour, including causing disturbances, disrupting staff and customers, acting irresponsibly inside the premises, and arguing with staff members when challenged or asked to leave. We requested any available images of the youths; however, the manager was unable to locate the photographs during the visit. No further incidents or concerns were reported during the patrol.</p>		
23/05/26	<p>Routine residential and public space patrols were conducted, including visits to open local shops. Staff at a local takeaway advised that incidents should be reported to relevant authorities. No anti-social behaviour or suspicious activity was observed during the patrol.</p>	2 adult engagements	
31/05/26 17.44 to 18.07	<p>A routine community safety patrol was conducted throughout residential roads and public spaces within Wouldham. Throughout the patrol, the area remained quiet and well maintained, with no signs of anti-social behaviour or criminal activity observed. No suspicious persons, vehicles, or gatherings were encountered, and no concerns were identified that required intervention or follow-up action.</p>
