	common. Cllr Adams objects. He feels that either side of these barriers	
	would become a new tipping ground. This week 5 vehicles have been	
	torched and the Forestry gates have been ripped apart. Budget problems	
	at TMBC are not WPC's problem. There is a fear that if this was made	
	restricted PROW would use as an excuse not to cut back the hedges. Cllr	
	Goode suggests if there is any money available for work on Hill Rd it	
	should be used to prevent the stones washing down when it rains.	
	BCllr Davis says that a unit run by an ex policeman used to be used to	
	track down fly tippers and wonders if that unit still exists. This is a	
	historical problem due to our closeness to the Medway Towns. All agree	Clerk
	that TMBC should uphold their duties and clear the fly tipping. Suggest	
	CCTV to be a good way of prevention.
